

Why Laramie?

More than ever, it is essential every individual deserves to be treated with dignity, respect, and equality, regardless of their sexual orientation or gender identity. Upholding these rights ensures that everyone can live authentically, free from discrimination, and have access to the same opportunities, protections, and legal recognition as their heterosexual and cisgender counterparts.

"The Laramie Project" is a powerful and poignant theatrical production that delves into the aftermath of the tragic murder of Matthew Shepard, shedding light on the impact of hate, prejudice, and the quest for justice in a small Wyoming town. Through a mosaic of interviews and narratives, the play examines the complexities of human nature, promoting empathy, understanding, and a call for compassion in the face of bigotry.

Please remember that the themes and incidences that are exemplified in this story are not unique to a small town out West. They are all too real for individuals in this cast, in this community, and maybe even someone in the audience sitting next to you.
